Points to Consider:

1. Under most circumstances, the first Hepatitis B vaccine is given at birth or at the 2 week newborn appointment.
2. When possible, immunizations are combined to reduce the overall number of shots needed per visit.
3. The Rotavirus vaccine is administered orally
4. An annual influenza (flu) vaccine is also recommended each year
