Points to Consider:

- 1. Under most circumstances, the first Hepatitis B vaccine is given at birth or at the 2 week newborn appointment.
- 2. When possible, immunizations are combined to reduce the overall number of shots needed per visit.
- 3. The Rotavirus vaccine is administered orally
- 4. An annual influenza (flu) vaccine is also recommended each year
